**BOARD NOTES by Jan Britt**

**CALL TO ORDER.** President Terry Kirkpatrick called the Board Meeting for the Olympia Kiwanis Club to order at 12:00 p.m. on January 27, 2011, at Community Youth Services. Board Members present: Russ Carstensen, Doug DeForest, Kathleen Drew, Jon Halvorson, Don Krupp, Ken Mitchell, Don Powell, and Lynn Urvina. Guests: Jan Britt, DeWayne Granacki, Bob Lien, Derek Valley.

**AGENDA:** The proposed agenda was presented to members and revised. Additions were made.

**MINUTES:** The minutes of the December 16, 2010, Board meeting were printed in the **Kiwanis Korner** and sent by e-mail to all Board members.

**MOTION 1:** Doug DeForest moved, Lynn Urvina seconded, approval of the minutes as presented to the Board. Motion passed.

**FINANCE COMMITTEE REPORT:** Russ Carstensen presented the Finance Committee report on behalf of the treasurer through January 3, 2011. All statements and bills were. There is a plan to collect outstanding dues.

\* Foundation investments and method for them were discussed together with committee responsibilities.

\* Don Powell's proposal related to dues and collection was discussed. Can we use the bank care/credit card machine? Yes. Should we have a standing agreement with member/s to collect through their bank card. No. Should we have a 10% discount if a member pays prior to August 31<sup>st</sup> of each year? Yes.

**MOTION 2:** Doug DeForest moved, and Jon Halvorson seconded we authorize and publicize that: 1) members can pay by credit card, 2) if a member pays full dues prior to September 1<sup>st</sup> there will be a 10% discount and 3) we publicize that members can pay in two installments if desired - 50% (\$70) by October 1<sup>st</sup> and 50% (\$70) by April 1<sup>st</sup>. Motion is passed. The policy will be changed accordingly.

**MOTION 3:** Doug DeForest moved, Jon Halvorson seconded, to accept the Finance Committee report as presented. Motion passed.

**NEW BUSINESS.** President Terry Kirkpatrick reported that Joanie Deutsch has resigned from the club and the Board. This means we need another Board member to fill her term.

**MOTION 4:** Jon Halvorson moved, Ken Mitchell seconded, we appoint DeWayne Granacki as a new board member to fill the position vacated by Joanie Deutsch. Motion passed.

**COMMITTEE REPORTS:**

\* Membership Committee: Russ Carstensen presented Ryan Strong's application for membership.

**MOTION 5:** Russ Carstensen moved, Ken Mitchell seconded, we accept Ryan Strong as a new member. Motion passed.

\* Upcoming Zone F Conference – March 19, 2011. Each club has been requested to contribute a basket for auction/door prize representing their club, at a value of about \$30, to help offset the expenses of the zone conference.

**MOTION 6:** Doug DeForest moved, DeWayne Granacki seconded, we spend \$30 from our convention fund to create a gift basket for the ZONE F conference. Motion passed. Lynn Urvina volunteered to put together the gift basket.

\* Club Meeting Time: 12:15 or 12 noon? Discussion followed regarding weekly meetings. Should we move the start time from the meeting up to 12 noon so we can start sooner and end sooner? If you come to a meeting on a holiday Monday and the "official" meeting is on Tuesday, you can eat upstairs with friends and call it a "round table" meeting, and still take credit for coming to a Kiwanis meeting.

**MOTION 7:** Doug DeForest moved, Don Krupp seconded, that we keep our official meeting start at 12:15. Motion passed.

\* Happy Dollars: Sometimes these become longer than the program! Shall we allocate a specific time for Happy Dollars? The consensus was that the President should insure the speaker's program starts by 12:40 each week.

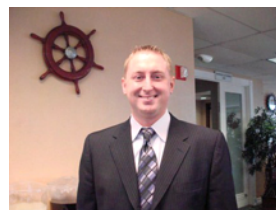

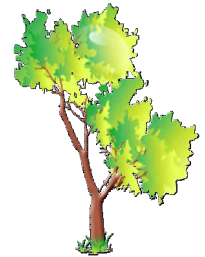
**BOARD NOTES** by Jan Britt (continued from page 2)
