Coming up this summer (July 9, Aug 13, and September 10, 10am – 4pm) will be our produce sales at the Lacey Community Market. At our May meeting your Olympia Kiwanis Board voted unanimously to move ahead on taking over the management of Harbor Days in 2012. A formal agreement remains to be negotiated with the South Sound Maritime Heritage Association, but this represents another major way we can give to our Community.

BOARD NOTES by Jan Britt

CALL TO ORDER. President Terry Kirkpatrick called the Board Meeting for the Olympia Kiwanis Club to order at 12:01 p.m. on May 26, 2011, at Community Youth Services. Board Members present: Russ Carstensen, Doug DeForest, DeWayne Granacki, Jon Halvorson, Don Krupp, Ken Mitchell, Don Powell, Lynn Urvina. Guests: Jan Britt, Dick Weldon, Bob Peck, Les Eldridge, Wayne Gruen, Jane Field, Charles Shelan, Matt Hornyak.

AGENDA: The proposed agenda was presented to those present. A few items were added.

MOTION 1: Doug DeForest moved, DeWayne Granacki seconded, approval of the agenda. Motion passed.

MINUTES: The minutes of the April 28, 2011, Board meeting were printed in the **Kiwanis Korner** and sent by e-mail to all Board members.

MOTION 2: Russ Carstensen moved, Doug DeForest seconded approval of minutes of April 28th. Motion passed.

FINANCE COMMITTEE REPORT: Russ Carstensen presented the Finance Committee report on behalf of the treasurer through April 30, 2011. All statements and bills were reviewed with an acceptable balance.

MOTION 3: Doug DeForest moved, Don Krupp seconded, to accept the Finance Committee report as presented. Motion passed.

Revisions to the CLUB Budget and How it Affects FOUNDATION Budget:

Corrections have been made for actual earnings from Poinsettia Sales and Casino Nite. Cancelling youth service grants, doubling up on scholarships this year (pay for last year's awarded scholarships and this year's scholarships). Moved \$4,000 total from the club to the OK Foundation.

PRESIDENTS REPORT:

Satellite Club Proposal: We will be meeting with folks from Waterfront Kiwanis the first week in June to review details of becoming a club satellite, which will operate like another committee.

Harbor Days Committee: The committee recommends the Board vote to approve partnering with South Sound Maritime Heritage Association (SSMHA) to sponsor Harbor Days Event beginning 2012. This provides an opportunity to 1) preserve and maintain community maritime heritage, 2) aid club's focus on children and families with a family event, 3) raise funds for club efforts for children and the community, and 4) increase club visibility.

MOTION 4: Don Krupp moved, DeWayne Granacki seconded, that the Olympia Kiwanis Club and Olympia Kiwanis Foundation form a partnership with the SSMHA to sponsor Harbor Days beginning 2012 forward pending an approvable contract. Motion passed.

Discussion followed. Income from advertising will go to the administrative account. Donations will go to the Foundation. Motion passed. (Russ Carstensen, as a member of both association boards, recused himself from the vote.) Thanks were expressed to both associations for the thoroughness and courtesy of the members examining this issue.

Club Leadership Education (CLE): Jon Halvorson, Jan Britt, Russ Carstensen, will be attending. Other new officers and Board members may also attend. Deadline for registration is June 3rd. Let Don Powell know if you would like to attend.

NEW BUSINESS.

Flag Day ceremony on June 14th at 4 p.m. at the Lacey Flag Pavilion (by Applebee's in Lacey). We have the largest flag in the state there, and would like to see Kiwanians attend.

POLICY 28: BACKGROUND CHECKS WHEN WORKING WITH CHILDREN:

- The Club requires a background check and a statement of "eligibility" for all members who have regular contact with minors through their membership in and on behalf of, the Olympia Kiwanis Club.
- The background check must be completed and an individual deemed "eligible" to volunteer with minors before the individual may begin the volunteer work.
- The background check process will be conducted by the Risk Management Committee, which shall compile and maintain a list of all "eligible" members. Members who wish to participate in activities with minors must complete a Self-Disclosure Questionnaire and sign a Consent to Background Check form.
- Each record will be considered individually and members will be denied "eligible" status only if the offense is substantially related to contact with minors. Members may appeal a "non-eligible" determination by the Risk Management Committee to the Club Executive Committee, whose decision shall be final.
