CALL TO ORDER. President Terry Kirkpatrick called the Board Meeting for the Olympia Kiwanis Club to order at 12:00 p.m. on February 24, 2011, at Community Youth Services. Board Members present: Russ Carstensen, Doug DeForest, DeWayne Granacki, Jon Halvorson, Ken Mitchell, and Don Powell. Guests: Bob Peck, Matt Hornyak, and Derek Valley.

AGENDA: The proposed agenda was presented to members and revised.

MOTION 1: Doug DeForest moved, Ken Mitchell seconded, approval of the agenda. Motion passed.

MINUTES: The minutes of the January 27, 2011, Board meeting were printed in the **Kiwanis Korner** and sent by e-mail to all Board members.

MOTION 2: Doug DeForest moved, Ken Mitchell seconded, approval of the minutes of January 27, 2011. Motion passed.

FINANCE COMMITTEE REPORT: Russ Carstensen presented the Finance Committee report on behalf of the treasurer through January 31, 2011. All statements and bills were reviewed with \$7,538.35 in cash with about \$3,800 in dues outstanding.

It was recommended that future month entries for "net income/outgo" on the cash flow report be modified each month to reflect known changes in our revenue or expenditures.

It was also recommended that the Treasurer submit a revised budget with adjustments as of April 1st to adjust it for current revenue and expenditures through March. This would be presented to the Board for it's March meeting and to club members in April.

MOTION 3: Doug DeForest moved, and Jon Halvorson seconded we implement the Finance Committee recommendations about the cash flow report and revised budget. Motion passed.

MOTION 4: Jon Halvorson moved, Ken Mitchell seconded, to accept the Finance Committee report as presented. Motion passed.

NEW BUSINESS.

Nominations Committee: President Terry Kirkpatrick called and recruited volunteers for the nominations committee for club elections.

MOTION 5: Doug DeForest moved, Russ Carstensen seconded, we confirm appointment of Don Krupp as Chair, with Charley Barron, Wayne Gruen, Lynn Urvina and Nancy LaPointe as the nominations committee. Motion passed.

Attendance Records: President Kirkpatrick has Secretary Don Powell complete a list of members by number of meetings attended, et cetera. This list can also be use for service awards. It was noted that there are several members who rarely come to Monday meetings. The president will work with the Board members to review the list and see if we can work on retention of members, especially for people we know well and find out why they don't come to meetings. Kiwanis International has changed it's requirements and members are no longer required to attend weekly meetings to be a member. Any and all service work hours count as having attended a club meeting.

COMMITTEE REPORTS: Membership Committee: Russ Carstensen presented applications for three new members, David HANSEN sponsored by Derek Valley and Shawn MYERS, sponsored by Jon Halvorson, and Linda OOSTERMAN, sponsored by Kathleen Drew.

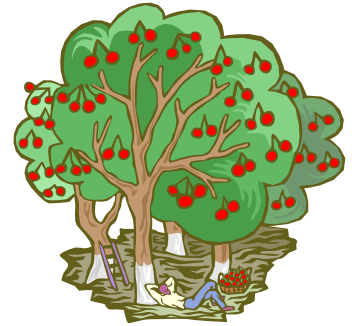
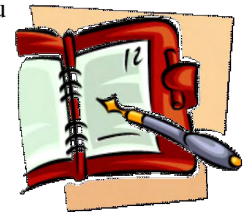

POLICY 27: COMMERCIAL MATERIALS AND ADVERTISING:

This document contains the policy of the Kiwanis Club of Olympia and the Kiwanis Club Foundation concerning the use of advertising, displays, printed materials, verbal references or descriptions and any other form of promotion (hereinafter called "commercial materials") by private, for-profit organizations in connection with any Kiwanis sponsored event, publication, display, or other activity (herein after called "Kiwanis activity").

In general terms the use of commercial materials is not allowed at any Kiwanis activity. The major exception to this general policy concerns the use of commercial materials in connection the sponsorship in whole or in part of any Kiwanis activity. The specific policies defining these general policies are as follows:

Neither the Club or Foundation is in the business of selling advertising or soliciting the distribution of display materials at any of its events, publications or other activities for the purpose of raising money to support its general operations and activities, regardless of whether the prospective "customer" is a member.

Neither the Club nor the Foundation will allow the use of advertising or display materials at general club meetings for a member or any for-profit organization, with the following exceptions:

If an organization or individual is a guest speaker or some other type of presenter, the name of a representative person and the organization may be used in the meeting announcement and by way of introduction at the event.

If the organization or individual is a guest speaker or some other type of presenter, that person or organization is allowed to distribute one piece of display material per attendee at the meeting. (to be continued in April *Kiwanis Korner*)
